COUNSELOR CORNER

During the month of October I will be visiting classrooms and grade levels and speaking to our Park students about how part of putting "First Things First" includes identifying what we are feeling. Once we name <u>How We Feel</u>, we more easily determine next steps for regulating our emotions. Students will have a refresher lesson on the <u>Mood Meter</u> and learn more about how being specific in Naming our emotions enhances and expedites the process of moving from the "Downstairs Brain" to the "Upstairs Brain".

A popular catchphrase we use here at Park is "**Name it to Tame it**". Dr. Daniel Siegel, a psychiatrist, writer, and professor who is also the founding co-director of the Mindful Awareness Research Center at UCLA, was the first to identify this technique. <u>Here</u> is a short clip of Dr. Siegel explaining the science and research behind this process.

In a nutshell, the "Upstairs Brain" is where we do our thinking, emotional regulating and problem solving. The "Downstairs Brain" houses our Flight, Fight, Fawn or Freeze reactions. We cannot be in both places at once. So by using the simple technique of "Name it to Tame it", we move from our "Downstairs Brain" to our "Upstairs Brain".
